





Start with first circle of color in it's pure form such as 100% yellow. Label the top.








Water down the yellow to about 50% strength. The color should now be half as bright as the pure color. Make three more circles next to the first one and let them dry.








The first two circles will remain as they are.


After they have dried, choose a warm color such as Red, water it down 50% by mixing it on the palette and then paint it over the third circle.

Choose a cool color such as Blue, water it down 50% on the palette and then paint it over the last circle.






As before, wait until these have dried and paint a watered down (50%) warm color over the third circle and a watered down (50%) cool color on top of the last circle.



Continue on down your line of drawing inks until each color has four variations that will include:

- Pure color at 100%
- Same color mixed with water to about 50% strength
- 50% original color mixed with a warm color also watered down to 50% strength
- 50% original color mixed with a cool color also watered down to 50% strength
